Every three years, thousands of high school youth and their adult leaders from across the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America gather for a week of faith formation known as the ELCA Youth Gathering. Through days spent in interactive learning, worship, Bible study, service and fellowship, young people grow in faith and are challenged and inspired to live their faith in their daily lives.

So, you're interested in attending the 2024 ELCA Youth Gathering...

...but you're already concerned about potential conflicts with sports, band, etc. and are wondering how to best have that conversation with your coach, band director, team leader, etc. Included in this document are some resources to help you out.



Conversation Guide

Answers to common questions about the Gathering, tips and tricks for making this trip work with other commitments, and important questions to ask your coach or leader.

Tips to Consider:

- Have this conversation EARLY. We know these dates a year in advance so that you can begin having this conversation NOW.
- Be prepared to put in extra work for your team ahead of and behind the Gathering if asked to do so.
- Emphasize the service learning aspect of this experience. The Gathering will *change* you for the better as a human being and as a teammate. You will grow as a leader, as a team player, and as a person.



Communicate early, include clear and complete information, and remind as often as needed.

What are the official dates of the ELCA Youth Gathering Trip including travel time?

Including travel to and from New Orleans, our group will be gone from Sunday, July 14 to Sunday, July 21, 2024.

What else is involved in the time commitment for this trip?

In addition to the trip itself, we will spend time throughout the program year (October-June) doing group building, leadership development, and fundraising, and diving into the *Boundless* theme for the event.

What makes this trip so special?

This trip is *not* a vacation. The Gathering is a year-long experience of service, relationship building, and skill-building that culminates in a week-long experience in New Orleans. In New Orleans, we will gather with thousands of students from across the United States and even other countries for four days of service, experiential learning, and relationship building. We will have the opportunity to learn from the people of New Orleans, hear incredible speakers about a variety of relevant topics, and above all experience the church in ways that are experienced nowhere else.

Because this event only happens every 3 years, students only have the opportunity to attend one or maybe two times in their entire lives.

Conversation Guide (cont.)

We want to help you make the Gathering a part of your faith timeline. If there is anything else we can do to support you in having these conversations with coaches, band directors, team leaders, etc. please don't hesitate to reach out!

Questions to Ask Your Coach:

- How can I adjust for being out of town these dates?
- What can I pick up ahead of and behind the Gathering to help the team?
- Will you please support me in my participation in this once-in-a-lifetime opportunity?

Use the form letters on the next two pages as a basis for getting this conversation started.



We recommend starting this conversation as **<u>early</u>** as possible. Begin with the form letter sent as an e-mail, or handed directly to your coach, as much as a year in advance.

After initial conversations, remind your coach again periodically of this commitment and it's value to you: at the end of this year's season, during any winter/spring training, and again before next season begins.

Be a team player and a leader. You will grow in this coming year, and the Gathering and preparation will be a <u>huge</u> factor in that growth.

Don't be afraid to acknowledge what you know you will miss, but also be clear that this is a decision that is important to you. This is a skill you will carry with you for the rest of your life--choosing what's best for you between two important and valuable experiences.
